



Glengormley Ambulance and Rescue Unit



Glengormley Ambulance and Rescue Unit is a voluntary organisation established in 1983.

We provide voluntary ambulance aid and provide cover for the benefit of the community in the Newtownabbey area, and whenever required, in other areas all over Northern Ireland.

We liaise with local statutory agencies, voluntary organisations and the public in a common effort to provide ambulance transport and ambulance aid for the protection of health and relief of sickness and distress.

This unit is run as a voluntary service and encompasses all sections of the community. It relies heavily on public contributions, subscriptions and such monies that are raised by members and the management team.

We rely heavily on volunteers and they are recruited and trained regardless of their gender or the community they come from. We provide volunteer ambulance aid classes which are organised according to age and ability and delivered to a recognised in-house certificate level. The training also covers administrative work and radio procedure.

All our operations comply fully with current child safety protection policies and all our staff operate according to current health and safety regulations.

We provide ambulance transport and ambulance aid presence for persons and organisations that have a need for such facilities in the event of injury, disability, sickness or any other related circumstances. We have two multi-purpose front line accident & emergency ambulances with fully automated defibrillators. We also have a number of community transport cars used for taking members of the community to hospital, medical appointments etc. where it is felt a fully equipped ambulance is not required.

The service has extensive medical malpractice,

including comprehensive and public liability insurance for the services we provide on public roads as well as off-road events. such as motorsport race tracks, sports stadiums etc.

Our services include:-

- Ambulance cover at public, sporting and social events (Motorsport, Football Matches, Athletics, Public Festivals etc.)
- Transport for community groups
- Transport service for senior citizens or disabled persons clubs
- Transport to and from medical appointments
- Nursing Home Transfers
- Hospital Appointments
- We can also transport most types of wheelchairs in our Ambulances
